BYLAWS OF

THE STATE OF IDAHO LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 6 REPUBLICAN COMMITTEE

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this organization shall be Legislative District 6 Republican Committee, hereinafter referred to as the Legislative District Committee.

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

The goals and purpose of the Legislative District Committee shall be:

- To uphold and defend the Constitution of the State of Idaho and the Constitution of the United States of America;
- To act as the GOP governing body of Legislative District 6;
- To support the traditional principles and objectives of the Idaho Republican Party Platform;
- To promote and support the election of Republican candidates;
- To advise Latah, Lewis and Nez Perce County Central Committees regarding the development of policies and functions; and
- To implement the policies and functions of Latah, Lewis and Nez Perce County_ Central Committees and the Idaho Republican Party

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: The Legislative District Committee will be composed of Precinct Committeemen representing the precincts within the legislative district and elected at the State Primary Election or appointed per ID Statute 34-502 by the Latah, Lewis and Nez Perce County_Central Committees, the Legislative District Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, and other such officers of the Legislative District as are elected by the Precinct Committeemen. All officers of the Legislative District shall be elected by the Precinct Committeemen at a meeting called by the incumbent Legislative District Chairman, to be held upon seven (7) days' notice and within eleven (11) days after each Primary Election, at a location designated by the Chairman. The meeting may be held anywhere within Latah, Lewis and Nez Perce Counties per ID Statute 34-503.

Section 2: Qualifications & Duties

The Legislative District Chairman shall assure the existence of a set of rules and bylaws for the Legislative District Committee. These rules must be compatible with the Election Laws of the State of Idaho and the Rules of the Idaho Republican Party.

for the purpose of removal shall be equal to one half (1/2) of the Legislative District Committee members, with a minimum of one PCO from each county.

- Section 6: Representation and voting by proxies shall be allowed at legislative district meetings except for the election or removal of Legislative District Committee Officers, election of delegates to the State Convention, selection of nominees to fill vacancies in the Idaho State Legislature, and changes to the bylaws. Proxies shall be honored if in writing to another voting member from the same Legislative District and limited to that particular meeting.
- Section 7: The Chairman may call for a vote via electronic mail. All votes must be submitted as a "Reply All" response. Thirty percent of the Precinct Committeemen from within the Legislative District shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE IV. COMMITTEES

The District Chairman may appoint a chairman and members of committees that may be needed from time to time for the following purposes:

- (a) Nominations
- (b) Credentials
- (c) Finance
- (d) Resolutions
- (e) Any other committee that may be needed

ARTICLE V. MEETINGS

Section 1: Regular Meetings will be held as follows:

(a) Organization of the Legislative District per Article ill Section I

Section 2: Special meetings may be held for the following:

- (a) Election to fill vacancies in the State Legislature (see Article VII Section 3).
- (b) Any other meeting needed to do the work of the Legislative District
- Section 3: Notice of special meetings shall be at least seven (7) days prior to such meetings. A meeting for the election to fill vacancies in the State Legislature shall be held within 10 days with 72- hour notice. In the event of a Precinct Committeeman not having an email account, the Chairman shall contact the Precinct Committeeman directly.
- Section 4: A quorum shall consist of 30% of the Legislative District Committee members, with a minimum of one from each County within the district. Electronic attendees may count towards a quorum, at the discretion of the Chair. Proxies cannot be used to establish a quorum and will not be allowed if electronic attendance is approved.
- Section 5: The selection of 3 Nominees to replace a Legislator per Idaho code 59-904A shall not use "Ranked choice voting" per accepted resolution 2023-3 of the IDGOP. The Committee shall conduct three separate balloting rounds at the meeting, to ensure "one person, one vote" as stated in the resolution. The final list of three shall be listed as 1st choice, 2nd

choice, and 3rd choice and sent to the Governor within the 15-day limit. Ballots shall be kept by the Secretary until the next election cycle is completed.

ARTICLE VI. PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of Roberts Rules of Order, latest revision, shall govern the proceedings of Legislative District 6 in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with State statutes, Idaho Republican Party rules, these Bylaws or Special Rules of Order.

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The Bylaws of the Legislative District Committee may be amended at any regular meeting of the Legislative District Committee by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting. There must be a notice of at least 7 days of the intent to address bylaws.

Section 2. All amendments shall become effective immediately upon approval unless otherwise specified.
