1. Reorganization

a. If the incumbent Legislative District Chairman does not call for an organization meeting after the Primary Election within the timeframe specified in the State Party Rules and/or in time for a selection of delegates to the State Party Convention, a majority of the newly elected Precinct Committeemen and Committeewomen in Legislative District 32, regardless of whether they have been sworn in yet, may call and run a meeting for the purposes of Legislative District organization and selecting delegates to the State Convention.

2. Meetings

- a. Regular Meetings need not be held at a physical location.
- b. A Regular Meeting may be called upon giving at least seven (7) days' notice.
- c. Voting at any Legislative District Meeting may be taken by an electronic method in accordance with State Party Rules.
- d. Fifty-one percent (51%) of the Precinct Committeemen from Legislative District 32 shall constitute a guorum.
- e. An Assistant (also referred to as "Alternate" in the State Party Rules)
 Precinct Committeeman or woman (APCO) who has been voted on,
 approved, and designated as such by the Bonneville County Republican
 Central Committee, shall, in the absence of an APCO's respective PCO
 attending a BCRCC meeting, have the right to stand in and vote for the
 PCO in a Legislative District 32 Regular Meeting. The attendance of an
 APCO will count towards quorum requirements for a Legislative District 32
 Regular Meeting.
- 3. Two-thirds (66.67%) of the Precinct Committee Officers in Legislative District 32 must be present to constitute a quorum in order to have a vote for censure of an elected official.
- 4. Amendments to the Legislative District Bylaws
 - a. Fifty-one percent (51%) of the Precinct Committee Officers in Legislative District 32 must vote in favor of amending these Bylaws, regardless of whether a motion to amend the Bylaws is made at a meeting that otherwise has a quorum in attendance.

5. General

- Adoption of these rules is by the rules set forth under Article VII Section 2 of the Idaho State Republican Party Rules.
- b. If any portion of these Bylaws is held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of these Bylaws shall remain in full force and effect without the invalid or unenforceable provisions.
